


2. Place assembled standards into floor sleeves. Rotate until the 11-12 years and under winch and tie-off sleeve are oriented as shown above.

3. Attach the net using instructions provided in the net box.

4. Once tensioned, the winch handle will fold up onto the unit for storage. Attach and tighten net straps to complete installation. If net height is too short, adjustable feet can be used to raise the system.

Note: Do not attempt to adjust feet while net is under tension.

5. The winch will come attached and tightened on one of your standards. Before play, confirm the winch is fully secured and tightened down.



CAUTION

•Uprights are equipped with a spring counterbalance mechanism. Release the Pressure-Lock Assembly <u>ONLY WHEN</u> <u>UPRIGHT IS IN THE VERTICAL POSITION</u>.

•Do not over tighten the volleyball net, as damage to uprights may result and void all written or implied warranties, or cause personal injury.

•Cable tension must be released before adjusting net height. Failure to do so may cause damage to the equipment, or cause personal injury.

•Never attempt to remove the height adjuster pin if the net is under tension.

WARNING

•Serious injuries, including permanent paralysis, can occur in volleyball. Such can be caused by falls on the head, neck and other parts of the body, or by running into unpadded volleyball standards. <u>Approved upright padding is mandatory</u>.

•While it cannot be eliminated, the risk of injuries can be greatly reduced by following proper safety guidelines and providing proper maintenance and safety inspections.

GENERAL MAINTENANCE

•Inspect this equipment for wear, loose fittings, damage and proper stability before each use. Replace defective or worn parts immediately. If in doubt, do not use this equipment until repaired.

•Lubricate tension winch periodically (at least twice a year) to minimize wear and to ensure proper operation.

STORAGE

•Under no circumstances should volleyball standards be stored leaning against a wall or other rigid objects.

•Lay posts down unless they can be securely fastened to a stable object or properly positioned in a storage rack specifically designed for volleyball standards.
